

SUBJECT: Air Force Reserve AGR Vacancy Announcement 17-0191EA; Closeout Date: Until Filled

1. A requirement exists for a qualified member to serve a 3-year tour of active duty as an AF Reserve AGR (Active Guard Reserve) in the AFSC and rank indicated below. Applicants must possess the AFSC, skill level or one skill level below and must hold the rank or one rank below to qualify as a candidate.

AFR AGR applicants must have 30 months' time-on-station (TOS) if PCS'ing by the position availability date. If they are less than 30 months TOS, a snowflake and TOS waiver approved through the member's wing commander or equivalent is required to be submitted with the AGR application package prior to the close out date.

Air Reserve Technicians (ART) selected for an AGR assignment will have his/her Mandatory Separation Date (MSD)/High Year Tenure (HYT) adjusted to that of a traditional reservist/IMA.

2. **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:** Analyzes and evaluates unit requirements and functions in support of the unit commander and staff as it relates to command and control under contingency and peacetime operations. Directs and implements actions in response to all Higher Headquarters (HHQ) operations orders (OPORD) and operations plans (OPLAN), specifically OPLAN 8010 in support of nuclear tanker alert and execution. Executes positive Command and Control (C2) of assigned conventional and nuclear forces and weapons systems. Advises commander and other key personnel on alert conditions, USSTRATCOM and CJCS orders, messages and directives. Responsible for the decoding and relay of up to 30 emergency actions messages per shift. Initiates emergency/contingency plans and checklists to notify and assemble the Installation Control Center (ICC), Crisis Action Team (CAT), Commander's Support Staff (CSS), and Emergency Operations Center (EOC). Provides key analysis to wing senior staff regarding the readiness of nuclear alert aircraft, status of nuclear alert crews, specific target information, and execution time lines based on USSTRATCOM and CJCS messages and maintenance and personal information. Initiates Aircraft Alert and monitor status of assigned OPLAN 8010 forces during exercise and real world contingencies. Responsible for conveying dispersal orders critical to the survival of the nuclear fleet. Initiates emergency staff actions (Quick Reaction Checklists (QRC)) in cases of suspected or actual sabotage, incidents or accidents, natural disasters, aircraft evacuation, dispersal, and all other command interest items. Develop and coordinate QRC's for response to contingency, peacetime, and other emergencies. Prepares displays and briefings. Monitor and report location of key personnel. Maintains and reviews chronological logs of events used as an official record of decisions and activities. Provides technical expertise and guidance during complex deployments and exercises. Provides daily changeover information to key staff and co-workers. Coordinates, directs, monitors, and reports mission movement during pre, in, and post-flight phases with on and off base agencies to ensure successful mission accomplishment. Serves as the focal point of contact and executes mission movement of the unit's peacetime, contingency, and wartime flying operations to include passing real time flight data critical to the success of USSTRATCOM nuclear forces. Transmits instructions to coordinate, launch, recall, execute and terminate, deploy and redeploy aircraft, aircrews and support assets. Analyzes, reviews and mediates all assigned and tenant flying schedules and coordinates it with all involved agencies to ensure aircrew and airframe availability. Provides AFRC, GMAJCOM, COCOM, USAF, and JCS with operational mission data Maintains certification in AFRC, GMAJCOM, and COCOM command post operations to include specific nuclear specific EA testing requirements, scenario training requirements and minimum duty performance standards.

3. **QUALIFICATIONS:** Must be able to work rotating shifts – day or night. Must possess advertised AFSC and skill level; can be one grade lower than advertised position. Be able to complete a three year AGR tour. Be available for Active Duty by the report no later than date. Meet AF fitness standards and must qualify for worldwide mobility. Not exceed weight standards. Possess or be able to obtain and maintain a TS/SCI clearance. Must be able to obtain and maintain COMSEC CAP program access. Command Post certification required with 801X experience desired.
