Citizen Airmen,
Let’s examine that term for a moment. As IMAs, you are first citizens, or civilians, and second, members of the United States Air Force who volunteer in service of their country as Airmen. Or, to quote my long time friend Col Darren Buck, IMA to the 460 SW/CC, “You are civilians full-time, you are Reservists part-time, but you are Airmen all the time!” To me, being in the Reserve is the embodiment of the core value Service Before Self , and you need to see your Reserve obligation as not a part-time job, but a part-time career.

And as a part-time career it’s important to stay regularly engaged with your organization. Let your supervisor, commander, or Unit Reserve Coordinator hear from you once or twice a month. Schedule your duty time in advance according to the timelines Det 6 announces. For example, your IDTs for FY16 should be scheduled by now. Go ahead and target a timeframe for your annual tour as well. You can always adjust as you get closer, but a lack of planning and communication with your organization indicates a lack of desire to continue serving. And if your organization feels that way, they will probably treat you that way. So be proactive! Engage with your unit even when you’re not on duty. It keeps you in the forefront of their plans, and they will appreciate it.

AFRC Leave Carry Over Program

The FY11 NDAA authorized RC members to carry leave earned during an active duty tour from one active duty tour to another active duty long tour for future use. This authority modifies the requirement for reservists to use, sell, or lose their earned leave at the end of an active duty tour. The use of leave carryover is not restricted to the next tour, but may only be used on future/subsequent tours that are 30 days or more (long tours).
